New Restrictions on Iowa Voters

Early Voting can be done

- By mail or hand delivery to the Auditor's office (absentee voting);
- In person at the Auditor's office; or
- In person at a satellite location, if one is available.

Absentee and Early Voting

- The first day to vote early in person at the Auditor's office is 20 days before the election. *(was 29 days)*
- Satellite voting locations *(like branch libraries and community centers)* require 100 voters to petition for a location. *(was the Auditor's decision)*
- Absentee ballots must be received by the Auditor by 8 pm on election day. *(Formerly, ballots were counted if postmarked before election day and received by the following Monday.)*
- Absentee ballots may be hand delivered to the Auditor only by the voter, an immediate family member or someone living in the voter's household. *(In the past voters could have their ballot delivered by anyone of their choosing.)*

Voting at the Polls

- Polls close at 8 pm. *(formerly, 9 pm for primary and general elections)*
- Employers must allow employees a minimum of two consecutive hours to vote on election day. *(was three hours)*
